Over the last year, Senior Concerns' Adult Day Program provided

156,000 hours of social and cognitive stimulation for physically or cognitively challenged elders in our community, allowing them to stay at home and out of institutions.

130 family caregivers received life-saving respite from their caregiving duties.

Adult Day Program



Through your support, Senior Concerns has awarded over \$140,000 in scholarships for the Adult Day Program this past year.

With your support, Senior Concerns provided scholarships for over 5,000 meals for low-income, homebound seniors through our Meals On Wheels Program last year.

In partnership with Los Robles Hospital and Medical Center, Senior Concerns prepared over 35,000 fresh, nutritionally-balanced hot lunches and light evening meals for homebound elders last year. All meals were delivered by community volunteers.


