Educational Workshops







Last year was a busy one for Senior Concerns and 2015 promises to be active as well, particularly given the increasing focus on our aging population and the need for resources to help seniors stay healthy and independent, and remain in their homes as they age.



In the past year, Senior Concerns was awarded almost \$200,000 in grants. Our grantors continue to support core operating expenses for organizations like Senior Concerns that they consider essential partners in the community.

2015 brings exciting developments. In January, we saw the first Conejo Cares event, honoring and supporting family caregivers in our community. Later this year, we will debut a new Adult Day
