As many of us focus on the struggles impacting the health of seniors in our community, all of us have a vital partner in Senior Concerns.

We are the **leading community-based organization** addressing social determinants of health. Social determinants of health have recently taken center stage, as individuals are living longer and endeavor to live well in our community.

Finances, nutrition, housing, access to services, transportation, caregiving, social connectedness and aging literacy all have a profound impact on a senior's health and quality of life.

Senior Concerns has enjoyed a 45-year history of offering community-based programs to address multiple social determinants and encourage seniors and their family caregivers to achieve their best possible well-being as they age.

Our **Adult Day Program** offers social connections, nutritious meals, access to transportation, and assistance with Activities of Daily Living for seniors with cognitive or physical impairment. Because it is a day program, we also enable seniors to remain in community, with family, friends and pets, either as a stopgap or long-term solution.

Our **Meals On Wheels Program** provides at-home food insecurity screenings, nutritious meals, safety checks and a break from social isolation for homebound seniors. The program also identifies seniors who may need additional support and connects them with the best available resources to meet their needs.

Our **Caregiver Support Center** offers advocacy for family caregivers through one-on-one counseling, social support, information, education and connection to care coordination services, including assisted living referrals.

Our **Senior Advocates** provide information, education and one-on-one counseling regarding benefit programs to meet seniors' needs; including Social Security, Veteran's benefits, Medicare and Medi Cal, affordable housing, food programs, transportation, access to pro bono legal and financial services and home modifications services.

At Senior Concerns we believe older adults have a lifetime of knowledge and experience and are valuable resources to our community. We touch lives and change them for the better.

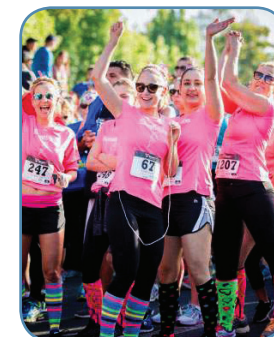
