

CalFresh (formerly known as food stamps)

What is CalFresh?

CalFresh is the California implementation of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as the Food Stamp program, which provides financial assistance for purchasing food to low-income California residents.

If you qualify, you are mailed a card that works like a debit card to pay for food. Each month your benefit amount is automatically loaded on your card for use. You can use the card at any store that accepts an EBT card. Your benefit amount is specific to you based on household size, income and expenses.
